Reflection: 'He makes me lie down in green pastures' (Psalm 23: 2) – copied with permission from Rev Donald Thomson's book, 'Reflections on the 23rd Psalm'.

A sheep that lies down is one that has no troubles; it is well fed and free from worries. A troubled sheep will never lie down.

One that is constantly on the move is worried about something – the faint smell or sound of a predator, an illness or wound. Sheep have an instinct of self-preservation that domestication has been unable to eliminate. One of the problems they face is that they fall on their side or back and cannot get up again. A predator just needs to knock one over in order to incapacitate it.

Green pastures? What is so special about that?

The country my wife and I have visited most on holiday is Spain. We lived there for a couple of years in the mid eighties, and have now visited every province on holiday. Wherever we go on holiday, we buy at least one picture book of the area.

I have a picture book of Israel. It has been used on occasions during small Bible studies to illustrate points I am trying to make. It has two double-page spreads of aerial photos. The first is of the wilderness between Jerusalem and The Dead Sea. The second is of the Valley of Jezreel. The former is arid and dry with no man-made features except the road that winds its way through the area. The latter is a riot of colours, and cultivation of many kinds. Imagine hundreds of market gardens, all together in one place. The pictures are used as an illustration of the difference water makes to the land.

Here in Scotland there is an abundance of rainwater. Whenever Spanish friends visit us here, the one comment they all make is about how green the scenery is, even in summertime. In Spain, the perpetually green fields we take for granted exist only on the Biscay coast, the Pyrenees Mountains and in a few other places.

In the Holy Land, green pastures are beyond the wildest imagination of the shepherds. They are the stuff of dreams. If they could graze their sheep on green pastures, they would be better nourished, and become fatter and healthier. There would be no limit to what the shepherd would do to find such a marvellous place.

That is the point the Psalmist is making. God wants the very best for His sheep. He wants to provide the very best pasture, so that the sheep can eat to their fill, and then lie down.

If only the sheep could only fill their stomachs instead of walking around from dawn to dusk in poor pastures, they would have no need to spend their whole lives in a constant search for nourishment.
