Opening Prayer

Psalm 23: 1-4;

Travelling down that road to Jericho, it would not be unusual to imagine that there was a band of robbers

hidden in every shadow; the road was notorious for that very thing.

Travelling the road of life can lead us into all kinds of fears. Some shadows contain something evil, but other shadows are just shadows. The increasing violence in the world, and on our doorstep, makes us more wary of the present and the future. Many face a daily struggle to cope with poverty, illness and homelessness.

There are many evil people round about us, and some we know who make our lives a misery. It is impossible to avoid evil in the world.

In John's Gospel (12:31), Jesus tells us that through His death and rising again, the 'prince of this world will be driven out'. That prince is Satan himself. When we are born, we are born into the state of original sin, and Satan has a place in our lives. When we accept Jesus as Saviour, Satan is driven out of our lives. Satan then tries to come back to us, to re-establish his authority over us. If he can't do that, he still tries to trip us up from the sidelines.

The difference can be summed up by the use of two little words. When we are born, we are dead <u>in</u> sin. When we come to faith, we are dead <u>to</u> sin. Death no longer has jurisdiction over us, because God Himself is our Lord.

The reason the psalmist says he no longer has any fear of evil is because nothing can break the eternal union between himself and God. No matter what he suffers in terms of evil events and life's difficulties, through faith in God, he knows that God is with him, and his eternal life in God's presence is secure.
