A little story I once heard raised a smile. Two women were comparing their summer holidays and one of them said "We went to Tenerife." Her friend asked her, where is that?" The first lady said, "I don't know – we flew".

Would she be surprised that her holiday destination was nearer Morocco than Europe? Would she care, as long as the sun shone all day, and the hotel was the same as the photo in the brochure?

I can remember holidays when I was very young. I can remember a beach on Mull, a house in Benderloch, my grandparent's house in Mallaig and the white sands of Morar. But I can't remember all the details of how we got there.

I was too young and unconcerned to remember the details. That wasn't part of the holiday. Now I know that we travelled to Mallaig by train, and the other places by car.

It didn't matter how we travelled, as long as I was with my parents and older sister. The destinations left memories, not the journeys.

When we go on holiday when we are young, we put all our trust in our parents. They buy the tickets, or drive the car, park the suitcases, and make sure we all get to the right destination.

There was a Bible translator in a distant land who was struggling with a phrase in Jeremiah. "Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in Him" (17:7). He was having difficulty with the word "confidence".

There didn't seem to an exact equivalent. As he pondered the problem, one of the people who was helping him with the translation came into his hut and said in his own tongue, "I am so tried, I am going to lean all my weight on this chair." Problem solved! "Blessed is the man... who leans all his weight on the Lord."

The Psalmist says, "You are with me. He might just as well have said, "I can lean all the weight of my troubles on you." You are with me: You are not a distant potentate who rules by remote control. You can speak to me and I can speak to You. As I listen for your voice, I know You hear me."

The shepherd doesn't say to the sheep, "if you follow this path you will find grazing and a pool of water. Now off you go, and I'll see you later back at the sheepfold." He goes with them, leading the way, watching over them all the time.
