A Prayer of Protection for Those Experiencing Active Persecution

God of the suffering and all in North Korea, Afghanistan, Somalia, Pakistan, Colombia, India, Libya, Eritrea, Yemen, Iran, Northern Nigeria, India to mention but a few who stagger under the weight of the cross of Christ, hear us as we seek to stand with those persecuted for being Christians. Through it all, the highs, the lows, the uncertainty, the hope... we trust in you. For you spoke and the aweinspiring diversity of creation came into being. Speak your words of hope, healing, redemption, love, and peace into our lives today.

All: Recreate us... Restore us... Remind us... In your image... In life-giving relationships... In the divine dance... We feel the chaos before creation in the core of our being. And we know you are with us. Breathe

your spirit through our lives, in *Jesus' name* we pray. Amen.
