MESSAGE: GO

Our God is a missionary God. Why is it important to See God is a Missionary God, as a God with a mission or as a God whose mission is now fulfilled in and through His church?

Our missionary God reaches out and stretches His love out to the whole world, every tribe, every tongue, every people and every nation (Rev. 5:9). He asks us to join Him in His mission - the mission of God - the **mission dei**. We do not go because it is a good idea, or because we are better than others. We go because our missionary God and sends us out to share His Good News, in word and through our actions. He says,

But when you receive the Holy Spirit - then go out as witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Notice that our Jerusalem is our neighbourhood (mission at our doorsteps - then a little further in Judea and

Samaria (the difficult to reach areas) then to the ends of the world) - Churches have gone out or sent missionaries to the ends of the world - to Africa and Asia - and forget Jerusalem)

The reminder and indeed challenge for us as a church - at local, national level is not to focus on ourselves and our survival - not to be limited by our own concerns and culture and worldview - but to embrace God's vision of going out and joining Him out them.

Our God is pro-active not reactive or passive. He reaches out to areas and people and groups that are yet to be reached with the gospel. He is not a 'maintenance-oriented God, but the Lord of the harvest.

Our mission - our going out is not just our duty - it is our destiny. It is a privilege to join the missionary God at work. This is why, he kept this message to end, before he was taken up to heaven. This is our chief and only business - to share His good news in word and through our actions. We call it evangelism, outreach or community action... It is the business that God calls us to be involved in - and it must begin at our doorsteps - our Jerusalem.

It is also every Christians business - some of us are called to pray, some are called to give, some to perform acts of kindness, some are called to participate in the running and maintaining of church - some are called to receive or offer forgiveness - but all of us individually or as a group are called to be witnesses of Christ.

A witness as a man or woman who has come to know the forgiveness of sins, who has experienced the grace of God, who has the Holy Spirit living inside of them, should be, can be and is commanded by Christ to be a witness.

This is what it means to be a witness, to simply tell with our lips and with our lives what Jesus has done for you and what He will do for anyone who will put their trust in Him. Witnessing is, as we read in scriptures (1 Chronicles 16:24) 'declaring God's Our glory among the nations, his marvellous deeds among all peoples'.

Witnesses are people who tell what they know. We are called to speak up, to speak out, to tell others what we have experienced and know to be true.

Lastly, our mission work must be done in hope. The farmer who sows seed, the baker who kneads leaven, must wait patiently for results. They must give up control. At the beginning, the outcome of their project may seem uncertain, unpromising, precarious. But the end result—large plants and many loaves — exceeds expectations. We join with God in sowing seeds of a new heaven and earth, and look ahead, in hope, to the harvest of a new creation. And sometimes we even get a glimpse of that new creation when our mission projects bear fruit.

It is reported that more than 24,000 women are missing nationwide. God, protect all those who are abused, fearful, or neglected. Be with those who are being trafficked, those who are trying to escape domestic violence, those who yearn for a way out, and those with no way out. May they know they are loved and not alone.

O Great Physician, we are hopeful even upon hearing the news that we are entering another phase of the COVID-19 pandemic. Yet so many of us are exhausted and fed up not

knowing what will happen next. Infection rates are rising around the world, access to vaccines remains inequitable, and lockdowns continue in Shanghai, China. Grant us the space and time to grieve all that has been lost. Bring rest to the weary, healing to the sick, and relief to those who hurt.

O Merciful One, we hand over to you all the fragments and broken pieces of our lives that we don't know what to do with—ruptured relationships, broken families, words unsaid, truths unacknowledged. There is no limit to your forgiveness, so we give to you all that may feel beyond repair and restoration. Christ, you said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." May these prayers make a home within our hearts and inspire us to share that peace with the world. In Jesus' name, Amen.
