Opening prayer

The Lord's Prayer

Bible Readings: Ephesians2:19-22; Colossians 3:15

Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.

Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful.

Reflection

There are many things that can divide us; age, occupation, appearance, intelligence, interests, political parties – but as, Charles Spurgeon said; "Sovereign grace can make strangers into sons." "When Paul wrote these words the kingdom of Rome was at the height of its territorial expansion and glory. Rome dominated the world. Roman armies kept peace and dispensed justice. Roman roads linked far flung reaches of the Empire. Rome had stood for hundreds of years and was thought to be able to stand for thousands of years more. But Paul looked at Rome and saw it, not as one great United Kingdom, but as a force imposed on mutually antagonistic factions: rich and poor, free and slave, man and woman, Jew and Gentile.

And in its place he saw this new humanity, created by God Himself, transcending those boundaries. The kingdom was destined to grow and permeate all nations, drawing from all peoples. It is a kingdom that cannot be shaken or destroyed – AND IT IS GROWING FAST." Today there are 2.5 billion followers of the Christian faith), representing nearly a third (31%) of the total global population.

In Jesus there is a place for everyone <u>and all are</u> <u>welcome</u>. We are a holy family and have a singular access to our Father through Christ His Son. We belong, we are part of God's household, and <u>God, Himself, dwells in us.</u> We belong to the church of Christ, to the family of Christ. We are God's children and all have a place at the family table. Our membership in God's household is not something that any one of us has deserved or earned - it is God's gracious gift, given in love. We are connected, not only with those around us, but also with the generations of apostles, saints and prophets built on the corner stone that is Christ Jesus himself.

We are connected past, present and future... We are connected. We are brothers and sisters - I know some are often put off when a fellow Christian calls them a brother or a sister. But we have a common paternity— God is our Father—the Church is our mother and Christ is our brother. We have family in heaven and on earth. With family comes benefits and privileges. No one should suffer alone or rejoice on their own. That is why we sing happy birthday... because we are connected, we are <u>family</u>... Of course, like any normal family – we too fight—we annoy one another - and sometimes we experience more bitterness than affection. There are two amazing things relating to being a family of faith. One is that are better together than apart. We are a team -**Together Each Achieves More.** So it is important that we work on our differences – especially those that could easily affect our life and work.

Secondly, as a Household of Faith— in Christ— we as children of God, are seen by God and treated by God— in the same way he would treat the Lord Jesus Christ. God sees us and treats us like family, with love and affection. guidance and comfort. We are all equal an one in Christ-Jews or Gentile, male or female, bond or free—regardless of any distinction whatever. We are all one and called to live in harmony with our brothers and sisters in Christ, and to let the world know that we are members of one spiritual family.

"In France some soldiers with their sergeant brought the body of a dead comrade to a cemetery owned by the Roman Catholic church to have him buried. The local priest told them gently that he was bound to ask if their comrade had been a baptized adherent of the Roman Catholic Church. They said they did not know. The priest said that he was very sorry but in that case he could not permit burial in the churchyard. So the soldiers took their dead comrade and sadly buried him just outside the fence. The next day they came back to make sure all was right with the grave but to their astonishment, they were not unable to locate the site of the freshly dug soil. They searched and searched for hours but could not find it. They were about to leave in total shock and bewilderment when they met the priest. He told them that his heart was so troubled in the night for his refusal to allow their friend to be buried in the cemetery that in the night the priest himself moved the fence.

In Christ, all are welcome – and all who receive Him – all who have accepted Christ in their lives as Lord and Saviour, all who love the Lord, have received the power to become sons and daughters of God. We are the Church (Gathered or scattered – we are church). Our purpose is not to rule the world or serve the world or flee from the world or imitate the world. We are in the world but not of it. Our mission is to love the Lord and to serve God and all His people, in word and through our actions. We are the church of Christ – bought by Jesus - Lamb of God and head of the Church. He laid down His life that we might not perish, but have lasting fellowship and friendship with Him, the Father and Holy Spirit – We are the church – the chosen people of God. We exist to love God with all our hearts, minds and souls and to love others as we love ourselves. We are the church – Yes we are – The church of Christ – marching on in victory, full of love and welcoming all who, like us, are keen to join us as we grow deeper in the love of God, closer in fellowship

and wider we share the Good News in Word and action, Amen.
